2010 NRA REGISTERED 2700 OUTDOOR CONVENTIONAL PISTOL TOURNAMENTS

Dates: April 17, 2010 May 15, 2010 June 19, 2010 September 11, 2010 October 9, 2010

Eligibility: Open to any individual desiring to compete in NRA outdoor conventional pistol.

Entries: Entries in individual events will be made by using the enclosed Registration Entry Form or a standard NRA SR-1 form accompanied by a check or money order. Personal checks and NRA Award Points will be accepted. Checks must be made payable to Anne Arundel Fish and Game Association, Inc (AAF&G). Either circle the number of events in which you wish to compete or check the box indicating all.

Individual Matches: If you intend to compete in all individual matches be sure to indicate your Full Name, correct NRA Member Number (if a member), Classification, and Category. Firing positions will be squadded on a first come first serve basis. Confirmation will be made only if the competitor encloses a self-addressed stamped envelope or Postcard. Confirmations may also be made via e-mail, if your e-mail address is provided. Mail the entry form with correct fee to:

Entries: Pre-registered individual match entries must be received not later than the Wednesday preceding the opening date of the tournament. Post entries will be accepted within 30 minutes of the match start time, on an as firing positions are available basis. Individual entries are limited to 22 competitors per relay. A second relay may be fired if there is a minimum of ten shooters.

Rules: Current NRA Pistol Rules will govern.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Individuals who have not been classified will fire in the Master Class. (Rule 19.6 Assigned Classification may be used.)

Challenges: A challenge fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge made. Challenges will be judged and validated by a designated 3 person jury.

Squadding Tickets: All matches will be squadded. Squadding information will be issued from the Statistical Office, located on the firing line. Squadding tickets will be available for pick-up one hour prior to the beginning of the match. NRA membership and classification cards must be exhibited before squadding tickets will be issued. Any competitor who fails to obtain a squadding tickets, or who fails to be present at the proper firing point when the relay is called, may lose the privilege of competing in the event.

Practice CMP EIC/NRA DR: Immediately following the first relay a practice CMP Excellence in Competition or NRA Distinguished Revolver Match will be fired using service pistols or .38 revolvers in accordance with CMP or NRA rules. The course of fire will be the National Match Course. A minimum of five shooters will be required to conduct the match.

Class/ Category Awards: Separate class awards will be given in each of the three categories: Civilian (Rule 2.2), Police (Rule 2.4), and Service (Rules 2.5, 2.6, 2.7). There must be 5 entries in a category or they will be combined within the same class as follows: **Service > Police > Civilian.** Classes with fewer than 5 competitors will be combined with the next higher class. Open award winners are not removed from the competitor count. There must be a minimum of five competitors in a class and category for a first place, 10 or greater for a second place, 15 or greater for a third place, etc.

Awards: Awards will be given to the open winners in each of the 16 matches. A first place award will be given provided there are five (5) or more competitors in a class and category. A second place award will be given provided there are ten (10) or more competitors in a class and category. Awards will be forwarded to winners by check, cash or NRA award points. Cash awards will be given to the top shooters in the Practice NRA Distinguished Revolver Match at the rate of one for every five shooters. For five shooters there will be a first place, 10 or greater a second place, 15 or greater a third place, etc.

Eye and Ear protection must be worn

Safety Notices: Alcoholic Beverages are Strictly Prohibited! Anyone believed to be under the influence of alcohol will not be allowed to compete.

Time of first match: Firing will commence promptly at **9:00 A.M.** Relay 1 will fire 22 and center fire matches, then break for lunch for approximately 30 minutes, and then fire the .45 match. If a minimum of five shooters is available for the Practice CMP EIC/NRA DR match it will start immediately after the first relay. If sufficient shooters are available to shoot a second relay, relay 2 will start immediately after the completion of the Practice CMP EIC/NRA DR Match.

Match Conditions: Scoring will be done down range. Competitors will pass scorecards right and score the target on their left; a range officer will score the high target. Competitors will be responsible for repairing their own targets. Scorers and competitors must sign each scorecard in order to receive credit for the match. Scorecards will be turned in at the conclusion of each aggregate match. Range personnel will assist in every way possible to avoid delays. Competitors may use NRA approved overlays to assist in scoring targets. To keep the tournament moving along smoothly overlays that magnify the target may not be used by competitors. Only Range Officers may use NRA approved scoring plugs. If a shooter disagrees with the point value of a shot a Range Officer can be requested to plug it. Once a plug is placed in a target it may not be removed until the score is resolved. Challenged targets will be removed from the target frame by a range officer and taken to the Chief Range officer for scoring. Competitors must provide their own staples and staple guns.

Range Facilities: The Anne Arundel Fish and Game clubhouse provides sanitary facilities and noon meals at a nominal fee during tournaments. Camping is permitted on club grounds, with ample space for tents and trailers. Competitors must have camping arrangements pre-approved through Paul Striffler.

Club Regulations & Safety: Violations of NRA or club regulations, or good safety practices, will result in the competitor's removal from the range and forfeiture of fees.

Do not cross the small creek.**

2010 CHESAPEAKE BAY SERVICE PISTOL CHAMPIONSHIP

Saturday, November 6, 2010; possible second relay on Sunday, November 7, 2010 depending on preregistration numbers

**NRA Outdoor 900 Service Pistol Match, and
CMP Excellence-in-Competition Match**

Sponsoring Organizations: This match is sponsored by the Anne Arundel Fish & Game Conservation Association, Inc.

Rules: Current NRA rules will apply to the NRA service pistol match, except that guns and ammunition used in the NRA service pistol match must comply with Rule 3.1 and either Rule 3.1.1 or 3.1.2. Current CMP rules will apply to the excellence-in-competition match.

Eligibility: This is an open match. Eligibility for the NRA service pistol match will be determined in accordance with current NRA rules, and eligibility for the excellence-in-competition match will be determined in accordance with current CMP rules.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used. Shooters who do not have a classification will compete in the master class. Assigned classifications may be used as provided in Rule 19.6.

Registration Fees: \$20 for the NRA service pistol match.

\$10 for the excellence-in-competition match.

Entries: Shooters will register using the attached entry form. We anticipate that the NRA service pistol match will be fired in a single relay of up to 24 shooters on Saturday, November 6; however, if the number of pre-registered shooters exceeds 24 we will conduct a second relay on Sunday, November 7. Pre-registration is therefore strongly encouraged. To pre-register, mail completed entry forms and payment to: Paul Striffler, 549 Bowline Road, Severna Park, MD 21146. Mailed registrations must be received no later than Friday, November 5, 2010. Registration on the day of the match will be accepted at the range on a space-available basis. Personal checks, cashier's checks, and NRA Award Points will be accepted. Checks must be made payable to "AAF&G".

Match Schedule: The NRA service pistol match will be fired in one relay each day, beginning promptly at 10:00 a.m. The CMP excellence-in-competition match will be fired immediately following the NRA service pistol match.

Course of fire: Slow fire strings will be shot at 50 yards on B-6 targets; timed and rapid fire strings will be shot at 25 yards on B-8 targets. The range is equipped with turning targets at 25 yards.

The course of fire for the NRA service pistol match will be:

Match #1 - Slow Fire (20 shots)

Match #2 - National Match Course (30 shots)

Match #3 - Timed Fire (20 shots)

Match #4 - Rapid Fire (20 shots)

Match #5 will be an aggregate of matches 1 through 4. The course of fire for the CMP excellence-in-competition match and the NRA distinguished revolver match will be the National Match Course.

Awards: Awards will be given to the open winners and class winners in each of the five matches comprising the NRA service pistol match, and in the excellence-in-competition match. Classes with fewer than 5 competitors will be combined with the next higher class. Open award winners are not removed from the competitor count. There must be at least 5 shooters in a class for a first place award, at least 10 shooters for a second place award, and at least 15 shooters for a third place award. Half of the registration fees, less match expenses, will be given to shooters in awards, payable in the form of cash, check, or NRA Award Points.

Challenges: A challenge fee of \$1 must be posted for any challenge, and will be returned to the shooter if the challenge is successful. Challenges will be judged by a 3-person jury designated by the chief range officer.

Squadding: The NRA service pistol match will be squadded. Squadding information will be provided beginning one hour before the commencement of the match.

Match Conditions: Scoring will be done down range. Competitors will be responsible for repairing their own targets, and must provide their own staplers and staples. Violations of NRA rules or good safety practices will result in the shooter's removal from the range and forfeiture of fees. Eye and ear protection must be supplied by each shooter, and must be worn during all firing. Food will not be provided. Sanitary facilities are available in the club house near the range.

Directions to Range: AAF&G is located at 1730 Saint Margarets Road in Annapolis, three miles west of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. From MD Route 50 eastbound, take Exit 28, Bay Dale Drive. Stay left to the stop sign on the service road. Make a left at the stop sign and proceed toward the Red Hot & Blue Restaurant. At the restaurant, make a right onto Old Mill Bottom Road. At the next intersection, make a right onto Saint Margarets Road (Route 179). Go 0.7 miles on Saint Margarets Road. The entrance to the club is on the right just before Mill Creek. If you cross a small bridge over the creek, you have gone too far.
